REPORTER

North Dearborn Water Authority ("Petitioner" or "North Dearborn"), respectfully requests authority on an expedited basis to issue long-term debt and adjust its rates and charges. In support of its Petition, North Dearborn states:

- 1. North Dearborn is a water authority constituted under Ind. Code § 13-18-16-16, organized and existing under and through the laws of the State of Indiana. North Dearborn's office is located at 28208 State Road 1, Suite 105, West Harrison, IN 47060.
- 2. Under Ind. Code § 13-18-16-16(h), North Dearborn's rates and charges are subject to the jurisdiction of the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission ("Commission") as set forth in Ind. Code § 8-1.5-3-8.
- 3. Under Ind. Code §§ 8-1-2-78 through 8-1-2-80, the Commission has jurisdiction over North Dearborn's issuance of bonds, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness.
- 4. North Dearborn believes the following statutes may also be applicable to this case: Ind. Code §§ 8-1-2-42, 8-1-2-61, 8-1-2-83, and other applicable statutes located in Ind. Code ch. 8-1-2.
- 5. North Dearborn owns, operates, and maintains wells, treatment facilities, transmission facilities, distribution facilities, land, land rights, equipment, materials, supplies, working capital, and other property which are used and useful for the rendering of water service to its customers. North Dearborn provides water to primarily residential, commercial, and agricultural customers in Dearborn, Ripley, and Franklin Counties, Indiana.
- 6. North Dearborn must make necessary extensions, replacements, and improvements to its waterworks system, most importantly, the replacement of its water treatment plant

("WTP"). North Dearborn proposes to obtain the necessary funds for said extensions, replacements, and improvements from the issuance of new debt through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Program ("DWSRF").

- 7. Although the North Dearborn was initially outside of the fundable range for receiving a subsidized loan from the DWSRF (see <u>Attachment A</u>, DWSRF July 16, 2021 Project Priority List), the DWSRF recently notified North Dearborn that it would provide North Dearborn with a subsidized loan provided North Dearborn could close on such loan on or before June 30, 2022.
- 8. In order to have sufficient funds to close on the DWSRF loan by June 30, 2022, make the requisite debt service payments on the prospective DWSRF debt, and pay its other lawful expenses to own and operate the utility, North Dearborn must adjust its rates and charges. Without such an adjustment, North Dearborn's current rates and charges will be unjust, unreasonable, insufficient, and confiscatory of North Dearborn's property.
- 9. To satisfy the DWSRF's timeline and requirements, North Dearborn requires an order approving the long-term debt and approving rates sufficient to show that North Dearborn can meet the financial requirements of the DWSRF loan by March 31, 2022.
- 10. North Dearborn's current base rates and charges for water utility service were approved in the Commission's October 1, 2009 Order in Cause No. 43736. As required by Ind. Code § 8-1-2-42, more than 15 months have passed since the filing date of Petitioner's last request for a general increase in its basic rates and charges.
- 11. North Dearborn proposes a historic test year comprising the 12-month period ending December 31, 2020, with adjustments for changes that are fixed, known, and measurable and in effect within 12 months after the test year.
- 12. North Dearborn will propose in this case new water rates and charges which will be sufficient to pay its expenses as set forth in Ind. Code § 8-1.5-3-8, resulting in an estimated \$186,451 (Phase 1) and \$172,127 (Phase 2) increase in its revenue requirement, which is an approximately 23% across-the-board increase (Phase 1) and approximately 17.26% across-the-board increase (Phase 2).
- 13. North Dearborn proposes in this Cause to incur long-term debt in the amount of \$4,250,000 through the DWSRF, which comprises \$3,950,000 in estimated project costs plus a \$300,000 construction contingency amount to allow for the possibility of higher than expected costs. The proceeds from the debt will be used to pay for a new water treatment

plant and other necessary extensions, replacements, and improvements to its waterworks system.

- 14. Included with this *Verified Petition*, North Dearborn is submitting its case-in-chief, which includes the pre-filed testimony and exhibits of Lori A. Young, P.E., and Douglas L. Baldessari, CPA, including supporting attachments, schedules, and workpapers.
- 15. North Dearborn believes that time is of the essence in that a subsidized loan is being made available through the DWSRF Program only if North Dearborn is able to obtain in a timely manner approval of its request to incur debt and change its rates.
- 16. Pursuant to the best practices set forth in the Commission's GAO 2013-5 (July 3, 2013), North Dearborn has consulted with the Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor regarding a proposed expedited procedural schedule. Concurrent with this petition, North Dearborn will file a motion for adoption of the expedited proposed schedule.
