# COMMUNITY UTILITIES OF INDIANA, INC.'S SUBMISSION OF TEMPORARY RATES AND CHARGES AND REQUEST FOR A DETERMINATION OF THEIR COMPLIANCE WITH INDIANA CODE § 8-1-2-42.7 TO THE EXTENT NECESSARY

Community Utilities of Indiana, Inc. ("CUII"), by counsel, respectfully submits herewith its temporary rates and charges in accordance with Ind. Code § 8-1-2-42.7 ("Section 42.7") and requests that the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission ("Commission") determine those rates to be in compliance with the foregoing statute and authorize CUII to implement those rates on January 9, 2018, to the extent the Commission has not already issued a Final order in this Cause. In support thereof, CUII states as follows:

- 1. CUII filed the Petition initiating this Cause on December 15, 2015 pursuant to, among other things, Section 42.7.
- 2. In accordance with Section 42.7 and the Commission's Recommended Best Practices for Rate Cases (GAO 2013-5), CUII also filed its case-in-chief and supporting workpapers on December 15, 2015.
- 3. Ind. Code § 8-1-2-42.7(e) provides that: "If the commission does not issue an order on a petition filed by a utility under subsection (d) within three hundred (300) days after the utility files its case in chief in support of the proposed increase, the utility may temporarily implement fifty percent (50%) of the utility's proposed permanent increase in basic rates and

charges, subject to the commission's review and determination under subsection (f)." Further,

"[t]he utility shall submit the proposed temporary rates and charges to the commission at least

thirty (30) days before the date on which the utility seeks to implement the temporary rates and

charges. The temporary rates and charges may reflect proposed or existing approved customer

class allocations and rate designs." Id.

4. The three hundred (300) day time period referenced in Ind. Code § 8-1-2-42.7(e)

expired on October 10, 2016.

5. In accordance with Section 42.7, CUII is submitting herewith its proposed

temporary rates and charges, which are designed to implement 50% of the annual increase to

CUII's operating revenues.

6. CUII proposes to implement the attached temporary rates and charges on January

9, 2018 if a Final Order has not been issued in this Cause, and accordingly requests that the

Commission review the attached schedules in accordance with Ind. Code § 8-1-2-42.7(f).

Wherefore, CUII requests the Commission review the attached schedules of rates and

charges and determine their compliance with Section 42.7 such that CUII may implement the

attached rates and charges on January 9, 2018, to the extent a Final order has not been issued in

this Cause, and for all other relief to CUII as is appropriate in the circumstances.
