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PETITION TO INTERVENE OF UNITED STEEL, PAPER AND FORESTRY, RUBBER, MANUFACTURING, ENERGY, ALLIED INDUSTRIAL AND SERVICE WORKERS INTERNATIONAL UNION, AFL-CIO/CLC AND ITS LOCALS 12775 AND 13796

Pursuant to 170 I.A.C. 1-1.1-11, the United Steel, Paper and Forestry, Rubber,
Manufacturing, Energy, Allied Industrial and Service Workers International Union AFLCIO/CLC ("USW) and its Locals 12775 and 13796 ("Local Unions") (collectively "Union"), by
representative, respectfully request that the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission

("Commission") permit the Union to intervene and become a party to this Cause. In support of
its Petition, the Union asserts the following:

- USW is an international union with 16 locals in Indiana. Northern Indiana Public Service Company ("NIPSCO") employs approximately 2,000 USW members. Approximately 40,000 USW members reside in NIPSCO's service area.
- 2. The purpose of this proceeding is for NIPSCO to request an increase in its retail rates and charges for gas utility service; approval of new schedules of rates and charges, general rules and regulations, and riders; approval of revised depreciation rates; approval of a mechanism to modify rates prospectively; approval of accounting relief; and authority to implement temporary rates.
- 3. The Union represents approximately 2,000 NIPSCO employees who have a substantial interest in this proceeding. NIPSCO's operating expenses include the salaries and benefits of Union members. In addition, Union members employed at NIPSCO are affected by the changing energy marketplace. Therefore, the outcome of this proceeding directly affects the members' terms and conditions of employment.
- 4. The Union has approximately 40,000 members residing in NIPSCO's service area. Many of these members and their families are residential retail customers of NIPSCO. They have a substantial interest in this proceeding because they pay NIPSCO rates for residential gas service and are dependent upon NIPSCO facilities, equipment, and personnel to receive that service.
- 5. The interests of the Union are not, and will not be, adequately represented by any other party in this proceeding.

the initial evidentiary hearing in this proceeding.

10. For the foregoing reasons, the Union respectfully requests that the Commission grant it

leave to intervene and make the Union a party to this proceeding.
