Ms. Heline,

In compliance with the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission's ("IURC") orders in Cause Nos. 44576 and 45029, Indianapolis Power & Light Company ("IPL") submits the enclosed Major Storm Damage Restoration Reserve Report.

On Saturday October 20, 2018, the Indianapolis area experienced a high wind weather event. For a period of approximately seven hours, sustained winds exceeded 25-30 MPH with wind gusts of 35-50 MPH. A maximum wind gust of 61 MPH was recorded at the Indianapolis International Airport during this period. Because of the winds, IPL sustained significant damage to the overhead distribution lines from trees. The restoration efforts lasted approximately 80 hours to restore service to the 56,601 affected customers. Customer outages spread across all of Marion County, with the heaviest damage concentrated in the northeast quadrant. Much of the damage to IPL's poles and lines were from large trees that fell on IPL's facilities. Many 60 to 80 foot mature trees, well outside the trimming zone, came down and caused damage. The first two days of the restoration event exceeded the IEEE 1366 threshold for Major Event Days.

IPL began preparing for a possible weather event early Saturday morning, based on the weather forecast. IPL crews and contract line crews were called and scheduled to begin reporting to work by noon on Saturday. Late Saturday afternoon, calls were made to contractors to request additional resources. Saturday evening, IPL made requests for Mutual Assistance. Mutual Assistance resources were obtained but were limited due to restoration efforts in the southern states resulting from Hurricane Michael, which made landfall on October 12th.

The total linemen resources deployed for this restoration effort, including IPL linemen, contractors, and mutual assistance linemen was over 200 people. The current O&M estimated cost of this storm restoration event is \$1,443,480. This estimate is based on invoices received from the Mutual Assistance contractors and estimated costs for those contractors that have not yet submitted a final invoice. It also includes actual charges and estimates for some support and logistic costs, such as lodging and meals for the Mutual Assistance crews. The total excludes IPL base labor

costs but does include internal IPL costs charged to the storm such as material, overtime charges for IPL labor, and estimated distributed charges. The final actual cost may vary slightly from the estimate, and only final actual costs will be charged to the Storm Reserve regulatory account.
