### TESTIMONY OF OUCC WITNESS DEREK LEADER CAUSE NO. 45806 INDIANA MICHIGAN POWER COMPANY

## I. INTRODUCTION

1	Q:	Please state your name and business address.			
2	A:	My name is Derek J. Leader. My business address is 115 West Washington St.,			
3		Suite 1500 South, Indianapolis, Indiana 46204. I am employed by the Indiana			
4		Office of Utility Consumer Counselor ("OUCC") as a Utility Analyst. My			
5		qualifications are set forth in Appendix A of this document.			
6	Q:	What is the purpose of your testimony?			
7	A:	My testimony addresses Indiana Michigan Power Company's ("I&M" or			
8		"Petitioner") request for authorization to secure lease financing for up to \$40			
9		million of nuclear fuel <sup>1</sup> ("fuel"). The fuel would be used at the Donald C. Cook			
10		Nuclear Plant, ("Cook Plant") which services both Indiana and Michigan.			
11 12	Q:	Please describe the review and analysis you conducted to prepare your testimony.			
13	A:	I reviewed I&M's petition, exhibits, and pre-filed testimony. Petitioner has made			
14		similar requests in causes Nos. 45417, 45126, 44827, 44490, 44025, and 43682. I			
15		read the petitions, testimony, and orders in those causes and in Petitioner's recent			
16		rate cases in Causes Nos. 45235 and 45576.

## II. BENEFITS OF NUCLEAR FUEL LEASE FINANCING

1 2	Q:	When will Petitioner's most recent request for authorization to secure lease financing expire?		
3	A:	I&M's most recent leasing authority, granted in Cause No. 45417, expired on		
4		December 31, 2022. <sup>2</sup>		
5	Q:	How does Petitioner's relief requested in this Cause benefit ratepayers?		
6	A:	Authorizing Petitioner's request would permit it to lease up to \$400 million in		
7		nuclear fuel. These costs would be recovered within its fuel adjustment clause		
8		("FAC"). The FAC semi-annually passes any savings realized through lease		
9		financing on to I&M's customers.		
10 11	Q:	Has the practice of leasing instead of ownership benefited Petitioner's ratepayers?		
12	A:	Yes. In Cause No. 45417, Petitioner's witness Noah K. Hollis testified that		
13		ratepayers saved about \$19.8 million between 2015 and 2020 due to leasing. <sup>3</sup> In		
14		this Cause, Mr. Hollis testifies that the company has recognized \$38.9 million $^4$ in		
15		present value savings since 2015. Thus, I&M has recognized an additional \$19.1		
16		million in savings since 2020 due to leasing rather than traditional purchase. The		
17		OUCC recommends Petitioner continue calculating the annual savings resulting		
18		from its leasing activity and provide that information to the Indiana Utility		
19		Regulatory Commission ("Commission") and the OUCC in future FAC and nuclear		
20		fuel leasing proceedings.

1	Q:	Please summarize your recommendations to the Commission in this Cause.		
2	A:	The OUCC recommends the Commission approve Petitioner's request for		
3		authorization of its nuclear financing agreements and continue requiring Petitioner		
4		to provide regular updates in future FAC and nuclear fuel lease proceedings. These		
5		filings should contain its nuclear leasing developments, including all terms of said		
6		agreements, and a calculation of the comparative annual savings to ratepayers of		
7		leasing the nuclear fuel versus ownership.
