I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

1	Q:	Please state your name and business address.
2	A:	My name is Jason D. Kohlmann, and my business address is 115 West Washington Street,
3		Suite 1500 South, Indianapolis, IN 46204.
4	Q:	By whom are you employed and in what capacity?
5	A:	I am employed by the Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor ("OUCC") as the
6		Assistant Director of the Natural Gas Division. For a summary of my educational and
7		professional experience, as well as my preparation for this case, please see Appendix JDK-
8		1 attached to this testimony.
9	Q:	What is the purpose of your testimony?
10	A:	The purpose of my testimony is to provide my analysis of Ohio Valley Gas Corporation
11		("OVGC") and its wholly owned subsidiary, Ohio Valley Gas, Inc.'s ("OVGI")
12		(collectively "Joint Petitioners" or "OVG") request for a phased-in rate increase utilizing
13		a forward-looking test year. I recommend adjustments to operating expenses related to
14		distribution, administrative and general, rate case expense, and OVG's accounting
15		methodology relating to the deferred regulatory asset for Transmission, Distribution and
16		Storage System Improvement Charge ("TDSIC").
17	Q:	What are your recommendations?
18	A:	I recommend:
19		1. Decreasing distribution expense by \$67,190;

2. Decreasing administrative and general expense by \$256,489; and

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1		3. Increasing regulatory expense by \$97,710.
2		I recommend OVG file a revised tariff if new base rates have not gone into effect at the
3		end of the 5-year amortization period to remove rate case expense from OVG's base rates.
4		If such an adjustment is required, the OUCC supports an adjustment to OVG's rates and
5		charges on an across-the-board basis.
6		I recommend OVG develop a written travel and meal policy to include a fixed per
7		diem rate that will be used while employees are on approved travel and submit it to the
8		Commission and OUCC within 90 days of the final order. I also recommend that OVG
9		develop a written company credit card policy to include clear and concise guidance to its
10		employees on what are considered to be justified business expenses and what are personal
11		expenses. This policy should be provided to the Commission and OUCC for review within
12		90 days of a final order in this case.
13	Q:	Are you sponsoring any attachments?
14	A:	Yes. I am sponsoring the following attachments:
15		1. Attachment JDK-1 - Distribution Expense;
16		2. Attachment JDK-2 - Administrative and General Expense; and
17		3. Attachment JDK-3 - Regulatory Expense.
18 19	Q:	To the extent you do not address a specific item or adjustment in this Cause, should that be construed to mean you agree with OVG's proposal?
20	A:	No. Not addressing a specific item or adjustment OVG proposes does not indicate my
21		agreement or approval. Rather, the scope of my testimony is limited to the specific items I
22		address.

II. INFLATION APPLIED TO EXPENSES

1	Q:	Did OVG propose an inflation escalation for any of its adjustments?
2	A:	Yes. Ms. Harlow states:
3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11		Non-labor expenses not discussed elsewhere in my testimony were escalated by using an inflationary factor estimated by the Federal Reserve Board in September 2023 in Attachment EMH-1. The two months of the Link Year November 2023 and December 2023 were escalated 3.3% (actuals were used for October 2023). The remaining nine months of the Link Year January 2024 through September 2024 and first two months of the Test Year October 2024 through December 2024 escalated by 2.5%. The remainder of the Test Year January 2025 through September 2025 were escalated by 2.2%.
12		(Direct Testimony of Emily M. Harlow, page 8, lines 4-10.)
13	Q:	Are there any accounts that do not include inflationary factors?
14	A:	Yes. Accounts without inflationary factors include "uncollectable accounts, healthcare
15		expenses, regulatory expenses, insurance expense, depreciation expense, general taxes,
16		income taxes, deferred income taxes, allowance for funds used during construction, and
17		interest on long-term debt." Id. page 8, lines 12-15.
18 19 20	Q: A:	Did you use the same methodology as Joint Petitioners when calculating your adjustments? No. For simplicity, I increased my proposed adjustments by calculating inflationary
21		escalation by 2.5% for 2024 and by 2.2% for 2025 and compounding the interest. This is a
22		more conservative method, as I didn't break out November and December 2023 at the
23		higher inflation rate of 3.3% Joint Petitioners used.
		III. <u>DISTRIBUTION EXPENSES</u>
24	Q:	Did OVG propose an adjustment to distribution expenses?
25	A:	Yes. OVG made numerous adjustments to distribution expense, including operation
26		expenses in accounts 401-870 to 401-881 and maintenance expenses in accounts 402-885

to 402-894, in addition to the inflationary escalation previously mentioned, resulting in a \$425,180 increase to the forward-looking test year. I agree with the adjustments OVG made, but recommend two reductions to distribution expenses for professional dues allocated to lobbying and customer installations, as discussed below.

A. Professional Dues Allocated to Lobbying

- 5 Q: Did OVG propose an adjustment for lobbying fees listed in distribution expense accounts?
- A: No. Based on invoices provided to the OUCC, OVG failed to remove lobbying expenses
 related to the Indiana Energy Association ("IEA"). When the OUCC asked whether OVG
 made adjustments for lobbying expenses, OVG answered, "[i]f the invoices did not include
 lobbying expenses, OVG did not make an adjustment for lobbying expenses." However,
 invoices from the IEA provided to the OUCC in discovery state: "[t]he Indiana Energy
 Association estimates that the non-deductible portion of your dues allocable to lobbying to
 be 15%." OVG's customers should not be responsible for non-deductible expenses.
- 14 (Attachment JDK-1, pages 3-6; OVG's Response to OUCC Data Request ("DR") 4-2.)
- 15 Q: What is your adjustment to professional dues due to lobbying?
- 16 A: My total proposed adjustment to professional dues due to lobbying is a reduction of (\$1,140), to remove non-recoverable membership fees for OVG's membership in IEA (the 15% of OVG's IEA membership dues allocable to lobbying). (Attachment JDK-1, page 2.)

B. Customer Installation Expense

- 19 Q: What did you find when reviewing OVG's Customer Installation Expense Account?
- 20 A: During review of OVG's general ledger, I identified \$63,000 in rebates that were paid to customers during the base year under account 401-879 for 'customer installation expense'

1		as part of OVG's Natural Gas Appliance incentive program.
2 3	Q:	Do Joint Petitioners currently have an Energy Efficiency Program approved by the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission ("IURC" or "Commission")?
4	A:	No. OVG does not have a Commission-approved Energy Efficiency Program. In response
5		to an OUCC DR, OVG acknowledged:
6 7		Petitioner does not have an Energy Efficiency program approved by the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission.
8 9 10 11 12 13 14		For several years, OVG has encouraged customers to enjoy the fuel efficiencies and operational savings of natural gas appliances through its Natural Gas Appliance Incentive Program. Any new or existing residential or small commercial customer or developer is eligible when they: Convert from another fuel source to natural gas. Install an eligible natural gas appliance, or Replace an existing natural gas appliance.
15		(Attachment JDK-1, pages 13-16; OVG's Response to OUCC DR 12-13.)
16	Q:	What is your adjustment to OVG's customer installation expense?
17	A:	I recommend a reduction of \$63,000, reflecting the rebates paid through OVG's Natural
18		Gas Appliance Incentive Program, as opposed to an approved energy efficiency program.
19		(Attachment JDK-1, pages 7-12; Listing of Rebates.) For recovery of energy efficiency
20		rebates, OVG should secure Commission approval of an energy efficiency rebate program
21		to help assure appropriate rebates are uniformly administered. Other gas utilities that have
22		energy efficiency programs with amounts included for recovery in rates have oversight
23		boards with all stakeholders involved that oversee the programs and offerings. Those other
24		companies also have reporting requirements on a quarterly or annual basis. OVG should
25		have an energy efficiency program approved by the Commission that ensures proper
26		protections are in place before those amounts are recovered from all of OVG's customers.

C. Total Adjustment to Distribution Expense

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1 Q: What is your total proposed adjustment for distribution expenses?

A: My proposed adjustment to distribution expenses is a reduction of \$64,140, consisting of a reduction of \$1,140 to professional dues allocated to lobbying and a reduction of \$63,000 to customer install expense. This is the amount of expense OVG included in its base period of October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023. As mentioned above, OVG inflated its base period amounts to arrive at a test year amount. I have applied the OUCC's inflation factors described above to arrive at a total reduction of \$67,190. (Attachment JDK-1, page 1.)

IV. ADMINISTRATIVE AND GENERAL ("A&G") EXPENSES

Q: Did OVG propose an adjustment to administrative and general expenses?

Yes. OVG made numerous adjustments to administrative and general expenses in accounts 920-001 to 930-001, in addition to the inflationary escalation previously mentioned, resulting in a \$2,929,151 increase to the forward-looking test year. I agree with the adjustments OVG made, but recommend numerous reductions to administrative and general expenses, as discussed below.

A. Professional Dues Allocated to Lobbying in A&G Expense

14 Q: Did OVG remove lobbying fees paid to professional organizations?

As noted above, OVG did not remove the non-deductible lobbying expenses allocated from dues paid to professional organizations. Three IEA invoices were included in OVG's distribution accounts, and one IEA invoice included in OVG's administrative and general accounts. In addition to the amounts OVG paid to IEA, OVG also paid the American Gas Association ("AGA"). An invoice from the AGA provided in discovery states, "AGA

estimates that the nondeductible portion of your 2023 dues – the portion that is allocable to lobbying is 3.4%." (Attachment JDK-2, page 5, Invoice from AGA.) The one invoice from IEA included in the A&G accounts had the same description as noted above regarding the non-deductible portion of the dues allocable to lobbying to be 15%. (Attachment JDK-2, page 6, Invoice from IEA.) The one IEA invoice and one AGA invoice in administrative and general expenses are in addition to the professional dues allocated to lobbying made in distribution expense. What is your adjustment to lobbying fees accounted for in administrative and general Q:

8 9 expense accounts?

> My total proposed adjustment to lobbying expense in A&G expense accounts is a reduction of \$668. This reduction removes the non-deductible fees included in OVG's membership dues paid to the IEA and AGA, specifically the 15% and 3.4% of membership dues, respectively, that are allocated to lobbying. (Attachment JDK-2, page 2.)

B. Executive Other Expense

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14 Q: Did you find any expenses in executive other expenses that do not relate to the 15 provision of natural gas service?

Yes. I performed an in-depth review of the expense accounts in OVG's general ledger and found multiple membership dues and employee holiday payments made to The Columbia Club, totaling \$2,581. The OUCC asked OVG through a data request for copies of these invoices and an explanation on how these charges related to OVG's provision of natural gas service. OVG responded that it had "maintained membership at the Columbia Club to host annual board meetings in Indianapolis, Indiana to reduce travel expenses to the general office in Winchester, Indiana after arrival at the Indianapolis International Airport." (JDK-2, Pages 8-25, OVG Response to OUCC DR's 4-2 and 12-7.)

- 1 Q: Did the response from OVG justify the expense for membership to this private social club?
- 3 A: No. An annual meeting does not necessitate membership in The Columbia Club. OVG's
- 4 customers should not be required to pay ongoing private social club membership fees that
- 5 are neither required for nor contribute to the provision of natural gas service.
- 6 Q: What adjustment do you propose to executive other expense?
- 7 A: I recommend a reduction of \$2,277 to executive other expenses as the membership to a
- 8 private club does not relate to the provision of natural gas service and should not be paid
- for by OVG's customers. (The OUCC has left the cost of the overnight visits for hotel
- stays, and only removed the cost associated with membership to the club.) (Attachment
- 11 JDK-2, page 7.)

C. Advertising Expense

- 12 Q: Did OVG propose an adjustment to advertising expense to remove expenses that do
- not meet the material benefit standard set forth in 170 Ind. Admin. Code 1-3-5?
- 14 A: No. 170 Ind. Admin. Code 1-3-5 provides a list of advertising expenditures which "produce
- a material benefit." The General Advertising Expense account 930-001 had a total of
- 16 \$27,342 in expenses directly related to advertising. The OUCC asked OVG in discovery
- for copies of all the advertisements listed in the general ledger. (JDK-2, pages 28-98,
- OVG's response to OUCC DR's 12-11 and 18-1.) After reviewing the examples provided
- by OVG in the data request, I found numerous items that did not meet the requirements set
- forth in 170 I.A.C. 1-3-5. Many of these items just had the OVG logo, with no mention of
- 21 how customers could decrease consumption or reduce their costs, and also did not include
- safety information. There were also instances where OVG was unable to provide copies of
- 23 the advertisements.

- 1 Q: What adjustment do you propose to advertising expense?
- 2 A: My total adjustment to advertising expense is a reduction of \$12,247. I calculated this by
- removing the advertisements that OVG could not provide copies of or that did not meet the
- 4 requirements set forth in 170 I.A.C. 1-3-5. (Attachment JDK-2, pages 26-27.)

D. Meals Expense

- 5 Q: Did OVG propose an adjustment for meals expense?
- 6 **A:** No.
- 7 Q: Does OVG have a travel and meal policy in place?
- 8 A: No. The OUCC asked OVG in discovery for copies of its meal and travel policy, and OVG
- 9 indicated it has no formal written policy. (Attachment JDK-2, page 100; OVG Response
- 10 to OUCC DR 17.3.)
- 11 Q: Do you agree with the total amount of Meals Expense OVG has included in base
- rates?
- 13 A: No. In performing an in-depth review of the expense accounts in OVG's general ledger
- and employee expense reports, I found numerous meal expenses OVG incurred during the
- base year totaling \$32,860 that are not supported by a written policy. Some of these
- expenses were for personal meals, and meals for crew/training and office lunches.
- 17 (Attachment JDK-2, pages 102-114.) While some meal expense might be acceptable, it is
- unreasonable for OVG's customers to pay for these costs when OVG has no written policy
- defining when meal expenses will be paid by the utility. It is OVG's obligation to show it
- is necessary to provide any meals and have a written policy to differentiate between when
- 21 meals will be provided and when employees are responsible for their own meals.
- 22 (Attachment JDK-2, pages 101; OVG Response to OUCC DR 17-8.)

1 Q: What are your recommendations?

A: I recommend a reduction of \$32,860 to meal expenses, because the evidence OVG provided does not show that the meals were necessary to the provision of gas service. (Attachment JDK-2, page 99.) To help assure OVG's customers do not pay for personal meals unrelated to the provision of utility services, I recommend OVG develop a written travel and meal policy to include a fixed per diem rate that will be used while employees are on approved travel and submit it to the Commission and OUCC within 90 days of the final order.

E. Employee Travel

- 9 Q: Did OVG propose an adjustment to remove any employee travel expenses?
- 10 A: No.

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- 11 Q: Did you make any adjustments to employee travel expenses?
- 12 A: Yes. In reviewing OVG's general ledger, invoices and employee expense reports, I
- determined that numerous expenses totaling \$5,088 incurred during the historic year were
- associated with the travel of employees to and from its corporate offices. (Attachment JDK-
- 15 2, page 115.)
- 16 Q: Do you agree that OVG should be charging its customers for this expense?
- 17 A: No. If any employee of a regulated utility chooses to reside outside a normal commuting
 18 distance, it should not be the customers' responsibility to pay for lodging, meals, or any
 19 transportation expenses related to the travel of that employee to and from its corporate
 20 offices. If agreements are made between employees and OVG management during the
 21 hiring process where it is known that the employee will reside outside a reasonable
 22 commuting distance, the shareholders should assume responsibility for the expenses, not

1 customers.

- 2 Q: What is your total adjustment to employee travel expenses?
- 3 A: My total adjustment for employee travel expenses is a reduction of \$5,088. (Attachment
- 4 JDK-2, page 115.) This adjustment is to remove any expenses associated with employee
- 5 travel for those employees residing outside a reasonable commuting distance. OVG's
- 6 customers should not be responsible for the commuting expenses of employees who choose
- 7 not to live within a reasonable distance to their place of work.

F. Miscellaneous Expense

- 8 Q: Did OVG propose an adjustment to remove any miscellaneous expenses?
- 9 **A:** No.
- 10 Q: What amount of miscellaneous expenses did OVG incur during the test year that are
- included in base rates?
- 12 A: I performed an in-depth review of OVG's general ledger and employee expenses reports
- that included various expenses including employee meals, liquor, 150 "Outdoor Cool Bar
- Tables", candy, decorations, gift cards, donuts, cake, webcams, entertainment streaming
- services, cloud storage, cell phone cases and other assorted purchases, none of which
- include an explanation of a business purpose for the expenses. None of the items mentioned
- above should be the responsibility of customers as they are not necessary for delivery of
- 18 natural gas service.
- 19 Q: What is your total adjustment for miscellaneous expenses?
- 20 A: My total adjustment to miscellaneous expenses is a reduction of \$23,036. (Attachment
- JDK-2, pages 116-117.) I arrived at this amount because the evidence provided by OVG
- does not show that the expenses mentioned above are necessary or recurring. OVG's
- customers should not be responsible for expenses that do not directly lead to the provision

of natural gas service. I also recommend that OVG develop a written company credit card policy to include clear and concise guidance to its employees on what are considered to be justified business expenses and what are personal expenses. This policy should be provided to the Commission and OUCC for review within 90 days of a final order in this case.

G. Nonrecurring Expenses

- 5 Q: Did OVG propose an adjustment to remove any nonrecurring expenses?
- 6 **A:** No.

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- 7 Q: During your review did you discover any nonrecurring expenses that should be removed from rates?
- 9 A: Yes. After a thorough review of OVG's general ledger and subsequent data requests sent 10 by the OUCC, I identified four expenses totaling \$33,721 that should be removed from 11 rates that do not appear to be recurring. The items identified as non-recoverable include a 12 monthly membership fee to TrueU, a company that provides leadership training that OVG 13 last paid membership fees in March of the base year, a payment made to Greater Heights 14 Service Company, an affiliate company of OVG that provides regulatory guidance, for a 15 one-time GCA Training provided to new OVG employees, a three-year membership to 16 Skyprep Inc., which provides OVG software to house its internal training program, and 17 late charges and penalties paid to the State of Ohio. (Attachment JDK-2, pages 119-138; 18 OVG Response to OUCC DRs 12-1, 12-4, 17-5 and 17-1.)
- 19 **O:** Why should these items be removed from rates?
- 20 A: All the identified items are not recurring and should be removed from base rates.
- 21 Q: How did you calculate your adjustment?
- A: I removed the total amount from the invoices for payments made to TrueU of \$5,733, since
- OVG had ceased payment of the monthly membership fee after March of the base year,

\$2,400 for the one-time GCA training provided by Greater Heights Service Company, as this is not a fee that will recur in the future, and \$4,189 for late charges and penalties paid to the State of Ohio, which should never be recovered from customers. For the \$32,099 three-year subscription to Skyprep Inc. for housing OVG's internal training platform, I agree that the expense should be recoverable as it is an on-going expense. For this expense, I took \$32,099, the total amount from the invoice, divided that amount by three years, the total length of the contract, and then multiplied that amount by two in order to remove two contract years OVG paid for during the base year, leaving the cost for one year of the membership in the base year of \$10,699, or (1/3) of the total contract price. The total adjustment is a reduction of \$33,721. (Attachment JDK-2, page 118.)

H. Outside Services

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11 Q: Did you agree with the total cost for outside services as proposed by OVG?

No. During my review of Petitioner's invoices for outside service costs, I noted numerous legal invoices where the detailed descriptions of services provided were redacted. I was unable to determine if the redacted legal invoices included allowable expenses. I also noted an invoice for microfilm transfer where the service was provided and billed prior to the base year, and there were no additional fees paid for this service in the base year. OVG also included redacted legal invoices for various merger and financing cases. (Attachment JDK-2, pages 140-201, Joint Petitioners' Response to OUCC DR's 4-1, 4-3, and 4-4.)

Why did you determine costs relating to legal invoices should be removed?

The OUCC asked for specific documentation of OVG's legal invoices through the discovery process. OVG provided a supplemental response, with categories of expenses. However, without supporting documentation and detailed descriptions of the work

- performed, the OUCC and the Commission cannot determine whether the costs included on these invoices are reasonable and should be included in base rates.
- 3 Q: What adjustment do you make for outside services?
- A: My total adjustment to outside services is a reduction of \$134,950. I arrived at this amount because the evidence provided by OVG does not provide detailed explanations as to what these legal services were for, and OVG's customers should not be responsible for expenses that did not occur in the base year. (Attachment JDK-2, page 139.)

I. Total A&G Expenses Adjustment

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8 Q: What is your total proposed adjustment for A&G expenses?

My proposed adjustment to A&G expenses is a reduction of \$244,847, consisting of reductions of \$668 to professional dues allocated to lobbying, \$2,277 for executive other expenses, \$12,247 for advertising, \$32,860 for meals, \$5,088 for employee travel, \$23,036 for miscellaneous expenses, \$33,721 in non-recurring expenses, and \$134,950 for outside services. This is the amount of expense OVG included in its base period of October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023. As mentioned above, OVG inflated its base period amounts to arrive at a test year amount. I have applied the inflation factors described above to arrive at a total reduction of \$256,489. (Attachment JDK-2, page 1.)

V. REGULATORY EXPENSE

- 17 Q: What increase did OVG propose for regulatory expense?
- 18 A: OVG proposes a total increase in regulatory expense of \$162,759.
- 19 Q: How did OVG calculate its proposed adjustment for regulatory expense?
- 20 A: OVG calculated this adjustment by taking the proposed rate case expense of \$1,057,812,

- subtracting the deferred TDSIC revenue of \$569,535, and amortizing the total regulatory expense of \$488,277 over a three-year period, resulting in a total regulatory expense adjustment of \$162,759.
- 4 Q: Do you agree with how OVG calculated the total adjustment for regulatory expense?
- 5 A: No. I disagree with multiple aspects of OVG's calculation and will discuss each issue
- 6 below. I also disagree with OVG's proposed three-year amortization of regulatory expense.

A. TDSIC Regulatory Assets

- 7 Q: Please describe OVG's proposed amortization expense for the TDSIC regulatory assets.
- 9 A: The TDSIC regulatory assets being amortized represent the approved 20% deferral of 10 capital expenditures and costs from Joint Petitioners' TDSIC filings. OVG recovers 80% 11 of its approved capital expenditures and costs through the TDSIC, and the remaining 20% 12 is deferred, to be recovered in OVG's next general rate case. OVG seeks to recover the 13 accumulated deferred 20% from its TDSIC filings in Cause No. 45400 that has been 14 deferred to this rate case. However, OVG removed the accumulated deferred 20%, instead of adding the accumulated deferred 20%. Therefore, my recommendation corrects this 15 16 error. OVG is proposing to amortize the deferred TDSIC Regulatory Asset balance over 17 three years as part of regulatory expense. (Joint Petitioners' Exhibit REVREQ8.10, 18 Adjustments to Derive the Proposed Revenue, page 11 of 22.)
- 19 Q: What is your recommended amortization period for regulatory assets?
- A: I recommend an amortization period of five years, because OVG's last rate case (Cause No. 44891) was filed in December 2016, or 7 years ago. Cause No. 44147 (OVG's next to last rate case) was filed in January 2012, so there was a period of 5 years between those

1		rate cases. A three-year amortization period is inconsistent with OVG's history of filing
2		rate cases. Therefore, I recommend a five-year amortization period for regulatory expense.
3	Q:	Did you find any errors in OVG's regulatory expense calculation?
4	A:	Yes. When calculating the total adjustment to regulatory expense of \$162,759 (Joint
5		Petitioners' Exhibit REVREQ 8.6, page 6), OVG erroneously reduced the amortized
6		deferred TDSIC Regulatory Asset by \$189,845. (Joint Petitioners' Exhibit REVREQ 8.11.)
7		Since the deferred TDSIC Regulatory Asset will be recovered at an amortized rate, OVG
8		should have added the total TDSIC Regulatory Asset of \$569,535 to its rate case expense
9		of \$1,057,812 to arrive at a total regulatory expense of \$1,627,347.
10	Q:	What is your recommendation relating to the deferred TDSIC Regulatory Asset?
11	A:	I recommend the total deferred asset of \$569,535 be amortized over 5 years, for a total
12		annual expense of \$113,907. (Attachment JDK-3, page 2.)
		B. Rate Case Expense
13	Q:	What is the total rate case expense proposed by OVG?
14	A:	OVG's proposed current rate case expense totals \$1,057,812. This total includes \$488,810
15		in legal fees, \$43,100 in accounting fees, \$200,903 in consultant fees, and \$325,000 of
16		internal costs related to filing this case. (Joint Petitioners' Exhibit REVREQ8.10,
17		Adjustments to Derive the Proposed Revenue, Page 10 of 22.)
18	Q:	Do you agree with OVG's requested rate case expense?
19	A:	No. I disagree with OVG's proposed recovery of \$325,000 of internal costs related to this
20		filing, because OVG's internal labor costs are already recovered through rates and OVG is
21		not entitled to double recovery of these costs. In response to an OUCC DR, OVG stated
22		the internal costs were due to many activities previously performed by outside consultants

that are now being performed internally. These costs include internal labor, payroll taxes,
and travel expenses for employees occurring from September of the base year through the
link year. (Attachment JDK-3, pages 4-5, Joint Petitioners' Response to OUCC DR 4-5.)
These internal labor costs will be included in base rates going forward, so including them
as part of rate case expense would constitute double recovery.

Q: What adjustments do you recommend for rate case expense?

A: I recommend a reduction of (\$325,000) to rate case expense to remove the internal expenses, resulting in a total unamortized rate case expense of \$732,812. Amortizing this amount over 5 years (as noted above in the TDSIC Regulatory Asset section) results in an annual rate case expense of \$146,562. (Attachment JDK-3, page 3.)

C. Total Regulatory Expense

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11 Q: What is your recommendation relating to the total regulatory expense?

A: Using my proposed unamortized deferred TDSIC Regulatory Asset of \$569,535, plus the unamortized rate case expense of \$732,812, results in a total regulatory expense of \$1,302,347. Amortizing that amount over five years results in a total annual regulatory expense of \$260,469, which is an increase of \$97,710 from what OVG is proposing. (Attachment JDK-3, page 1.)

17 Q: Do you have any additional recommendations for regulatory expense?

Yes. If new base rates have not gone into effect at the end of the 5-year amortization period, I recommend OVG file a revised tariff to remove rate case expense from OVG's base rates. If such an adjustment is required, the OUCC supports an adjustment to OVG's rates and charges on an across-the-board basis. This is the same treatment required in the Commission's recent Indiana American Water rate case order. *In re Indiana-American*

Water Company, Inc., Cause NO. 45870, Final Order p. 83 (Ind. Util. Regul. Comm'n
 February 14, 2014).

VI. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3 Q: Please summarize your recommendations to the Commission.
- 4 A: I recommend the Commission order OVG to:
- 5 1. Decrease its requested distribution expense by \$67,190;
 - 2. Decrease its requested administrative expense by \$256,489; and
 - 3. Increase regulatory expense by \$97,710.

I recommend OVG file a revised tariff if new base rates have not gone into effect at the end of the 5-year amortization period to remove rate case expense from OVG's base rates. If such an adjustment is required, the OUCC supports an adjustment to OVG's rates and charges on an across-the-board basis.

I recommend OVG develop a written travel and meal policy to include a fixed per diem rate that will be used while employees are on approved travel and submit it to the Commission and OUCC within 90 days of the final order. I also recommend that OVG develop a written company credit card policy to include clear and concise guidance to its employees on what are considered to be justified business expenses and what are personal expenses. This policy should be provided to the Commission and OUCC for review within 90 days of a final order in this case.

- 19 **Q:** Does this conclude your testimony?
- 20 A: Yes.

For several years, OVG has encouraged customers to enjoy the fuel efficiencies and operational savings of natural gas appliances through its <u>Natural Gas Appliance Incentive Program</u>. Any new or existing residential or small commercial customer or developer is eligible when they:

- Convert from another fuel source to natural gas.
- Install an eligible natural gas appliance, or
- Replace an existing natural gas appliance.

The program is designed to:

- Encourage greater efficiencies with greater dollar amounts awarded for higher efficiency rated appliances.
- Assist customers with costs associated when converting from another fuel source to natural gas or added costs in new construction when natural gas is utilized.

OVG has kept the same program emphasis for several years. OVG does verify each installation to ensure incentives are granted accurately and as intended.

OVG actively promotes incentives through its website, district office displays, media outlets and via handouts at local events along with personal contact between employees and customers.

The incentive is awarded as a credit to the customer's gas account 142 through OVG's billing system or as a check directly to the recipient. Operations Account 401-879 Customer Installation Expense is debited.

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Young, Murphy reintroduce bill to protect workers

WASHINGTON, D.C. -Senators Todd Young (R-Ind.) and Chris Murphy (D-Conn.) reintroduced the Workforce Mobility Act, bipartisan legislation to limit the use of non-compete agreements that negatively impact American workers. Senators Tim Kaine (D-Va.) and Kevin Cramer (R-N.D.) co-sponsored the legislation. Congressmen Scott Peters (D-Calif.) and Mike Gallagher (R-Wis.) introduced the legislation in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Almost one in five American workers — 30 million people – are constrained by a non-compete agreement, which blocks workers from leaving their jobs for a competing employer or starting a competing business. Research indicates that workers trapped by non-competes have lower wages, and their restricted mobility makes it more difficult for businesses to recruit talent. In states where non-competes are enforced, young firms are more likely to die in their first three years compared to states where they are not enforced.

wage growth, career advancement, innovation, business creation, and human freedom. Our bill aims to remove these barriers and create opportunities that help, not hinder, Hoosier workers," said Young. "The reforms in our legislation will assist workers and entrepreneurs so they can freely apply their talents where their skills are in greatest demand."

"Across industries and income brackets, non-competes are terrible for workers and a major drag on economic growth. It's ridiculous we let companies hide behind these agreements as a means to depress wages and stave off competition. rule to ban the use of non-competes, but Congress should go even further and pass our legislation to protect workers and support entrepreneurs," said Murphy.

"Companies shouldn't be able to restrict Americans' freedom to pursue different jobs," said Kaine. "Non-compete agreements suppress wages, make it harder for businesses to hire talent, and hinder our economic growth. taken.

"Non-compete agreements stifle I'm proud to join my colleagues in introducing this bill to support workers."

"Non-compete agreements stifle innovation and job mobility. North Dakota is a national leader in blocking these inhibitive practices," said Cramer. "Our bipartisan bill makes non-competes virtually illegal and puts more back into the hands of the American worker.'

The Workforce Mobility Act would:

- Narrow the use of non-compete agreements to include only necessary instances of a dissolution of a partnership or the sale of a business:
- · Require employers to make I'm glad the FTC has proposed a their employees aware of the limitation on non-competes, as studies have found that non-competes are often used even when they are illegal or unenforceable. The Department of Labor would also be given the authority to make the public aware of the limitation; and
 - Require the Federal Trade Commission and the Department of Labor to submit a report to Congress on any enforcement actions



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

Exterior renovations that improve curb appeal

Neglecting a home's exterior can be a disservice to homeowners, particularly those looking to increase the value of their homes. Curb appeal is important, as a home's appearance can greatly affect prospective buyers' perceptions.

- Garage door replacement: Homeowners can recoup 97.5 percent of their investment on a new garage door. This remodel tops the list for good looks and value. The average cost of \$3,611 is for replacing an existing two-car garage.
- Manufactured stone veneer: Replacing a portion of vinyl siding with stone veneer can greatly improve curb appeal, adding style that can set a home apart. Homeowners can expect to recoup a 94.9 percent return on their investment.
- Wood deck addition: A wooden deck on the rear or side of a home enhances homeowners' ability to enjoy the outdoors year-round. A wood deck addition recoups 75.6 of the cost of homeowners' initial investment.
- Siding replacement: Not only does old or weathered siding look unsightly, it can impact the energy efficiency of a home. Even though a siding replacement project is costly
 — at roughly \$16,000 — it offers a 75 percent return and peace of mind that the home is being well-protected from the elements.
- New entry door: Replacing an existing door with a 20-gauge steel door complete with clear dual-pane half-glass panel, jambs and an aluminum threshold with composite stop gets homeowners 75 percent of their initial investment back at resale. Improving the door isn't all about good looks, either. A door that isn't well-insulated or secure can be problematic.

In addition to these improvements, homeowners would be wise to focus on some upgraded landscaping, an upgraded roof, new windows, and improved exterior lighting as surefire ways to add curb appeal and potential value to

prised us once and they are much better team. Is it enough?









Solar panels don't come cheap, some materials used to make the panels are very expensive and not easy to get. Getting enough land to put in a solar farm also raises the cost. Land prices are going up and we aren't getting anymore, so finding a farmer willing to get rid of ground will cost a pretty penny.

Solar power has the longest lifespan of renewable energy sources. The fields can continue to generate electricity for 30 to 40 years. They are hardly ever damaged, and they do not need much maintenance. Despite the huge cost of setting up a solar farm, its long lifespan and very low maintenance cost make them a cost-effective energy solution. Solar panels don't involve a turbine, unlike other sources, it has no moving parts. That means that nothing wears out or breaks very often. Once the solar panels are installed, they continue to generate solar power as long as the sun is shining.

Power generation using fossil fuels is a very loud activity. Even among renewable energy sources, noise is a bit of a concern. This is one of the main downsides to wind energy. Solar farms generate electricity silently.

Very large areas of land are required for building solar farms. Typically they are located in remote locations, this means that they will take the place on farm ground.

With a shortage of food in the world and world hunger a big problem, removing ground to grow crops will not help food shortages at all.

Solar farms provide job opportunities to the local community. This in turn

helps in reviving the economy of the area. This is only when building a solar farm. There is no denying that solar farms are expensive to set up, but so is every other energy source.

The lifespan and low maintenance give solar farms an economical advantage.

Solar energy production itself is clean and doesn't harm the environment in any way. The construction of solar farms contribute to greenhouse gas emissions and air pollution. The decommissioned solar panels contain very toxic materials, resulting in land and water pollution. This is one of the major disadvantages of solar energy.

Solar farms are spread over large areas because lots of space is needed for setting up solar panels. This means solar farms often are built on farmland. How to create more privacy on your property

An inviting backyard can serve as a welcome retreat from the hustle and bustle of daily life. After a long day at the office or an exhausting day spent transporting kids to and fro, it's hard to resist the allure of a peaceful outdoor space in which to unwind.

Privacy is a key component of any backyard oasis. Some homes may be so remote that privacy isn't an issue. But many suburban homeowners recognize they might need to tweak their landscapes if they hope to create a private oasis outside.

Fencing or planting?

Most homeowners looking to create more privacy on their property will have to choose between fencing and planting. Fencing provides immediate privacy because, once it's installed, no one can see into the yard. Fencing also doesn't require watering or other im-

mediate upkeep, which will be necessary when planting to ensure tree roots can establish themselves.

But planting has its benefits as well. Planting for privacy is essentially creating a living fence that can grow over time and provide even more privacy as trees reach maturity. Plants also tend to be less costly than fencing. The renovation experts BobVila.com estimate that fencing projects typically cost between \$1,667 and \$4,075. However, fencing projects can cost considerably more than \$4,000, especially for homeowners with large properties they want to enclose. Large, mature trees can be expensive, though it's unlikely they will cost as much as fencing. In addition, fencing requires more maintenance and will potentially need to be replaced, while native trees won't require much upkeep and can last for generations.

Planting

Homeowners who choose to plant

for privacy will next have to decide which type of plants to add to their properties. Evergreens provide year-round privacy because they don't shed their leaves, so these are the ones most often chosen when creating a living fence. A number of varieties of evergreen trees can do the job, but it's important that homeowners consult with a landscape architect prior to choosing trees so they can ensure the trees will thrive when faced with the growing conditions on their properties. During such a consultation, homeowners may discuss the following popular privacy trees.

• Leyland cypress: The Arbor Day Foundation® notes that the Leyland cypress is popular for hedges and boundaries, likely because a typical tree reaches a mature height of 60'-70' and can spread as wide as 25'. The Leyland cypress grows fast, which may appeal to homeowners who don't want to wait to establish privacy.

• Green Giant Arborvitae: There are different varieties of the arborvitae, but the Green Giant tends to be the goto option for privacy. The ADF notes that Green Giants will grow up to three feet per year until they reach maturity, providing a fast-growing option for privacy planters. The Green Giant can spread as wide as 20 feet at maturity, which is another attribute that makes it so popular among homeowners desiring privacy.

• Eastern White Pine: The ADF notes that the eastern white pine, which can reach heights as high as 80 feet, is favored in spacious yards. That's likely due to its height and its potential spread, which can reach 40 feet. Homeowners who choose the eastern white pine might like it for its resemblance to a Christmas tree, and in fact it is widely used for that purpose. The privacy provided by the eastern white pine is significant, but it might be best suited to especially large properties.

Crossing South Section Street and heading north was Dr. Ramsey's Chiropractor Office on the southeast corner of Section and Jackson Street, Pierce's Shell Service Station was on the northeast corner, and the Dixie Grill, owned and operated by Rudy and Lucille Weil at one time, was between Pierce's Shell Station and Pierce's Philgas & Appliance Store. A Phillips 66 Service Station was on the corner of Section and West Washington Street. Custer's Marathon Service Station was on the northeast corner, and Sullivan Hotel was located north of Custer's. Index Notions Company had its offices on the east side of Section Street by the hotel, and Stahl's Standard Service Station was on the northeast corner of Wall & Section Streets.

Heading east on West Washington Street from Custer's Marathon was a building with three arched entrances that housed six business locations. Watson-Chaney Insurance office, a beauty parlor, and Brown and Woodsmall Accounting Office were there along with Dr. Fisher's optometry office, Dr. Steele's dentist office, and Dr. Henderson's optometry office. To the east was Branstetter's Grocery, Sullivan Loan Company, and Patton's Appliances. Farmers State Bank was on the corner of Washington and

Court Street, Louie Meier's Law Office was on the second floor of the bank building.

The Sherman Building was across from the Farmers State Bank. And west of the alley was the building that housed the offices of Dr. Parmenter, Dr. Scott, Dr. Libke, and Dr. Eskew. Sullivan Hardware & Furniture Store was next to the service station on the corner.

Heading north of the square on Court Street was Benny Defrank Shoe Shop, Index Notion Company 5 and 10, and Dr. Bedwell's office, The Davis Hotel had occupied the rest of the block until it burned down in 1953. Around 1957 a grocery store was built on the hotel site, where the fire department and city hall are now.

On the other side of North Court

heading north from the square was Kroger Grocery Store which occupied the block tothe alley. I don't remember most of the businesses that occupied the small store fronts from the alley to the Public Service Office on the north end of the block and several people I talked to couldn't think of what they were, either. I do know that Cadwell Music House was one of them, because my father spent a lot of time there. Lillian Dale Scott had a studio for piano lessons on the second floor above Cadwell's, and Gallagher Gift & Jewelry Shop was there in 1949 and may still have been there in the late 50's. Carrither's Funeral Home was on the northeast corner of Wall and North Court Street and Sim's Sinclair Station was on the northwest comer.


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SULLIVAN SQUARE AROUND 1970

No internal rate case labor is in the future test year. OVG believes these costs are not in the current rates. Total labor cost in Cause No. 44891 Schedule 11 was \$6.1M (\$5.6 expensed). Base year total labor was \$8.8M (\$6.6M expensed). Many activities performed in prior rate cases by outside consultants and are now being performed internally.
