<u>VERIFIED PETITION OF SHANNON M. MATERA</u> <u>FOR TEMPORARY ADMISSION</u>

I, Shannon M. Matera, being duly sworn according to law and in support of my Verified Petition for Temporary Admission, state as follows:

1. I hereby respectfully request permission for temporary admission pursuant to Rule 3(2) of the Indiana Rules for Admission to the Bar and the Discipline of Attorneys to appear as counsel *pro hac vice* for proposed Intervenor, Department of the Navy ("DON") on behalf of the Federal Executive Agencies ("FEA"), in the following administrative proceeding now pending before the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission ("Commission") in Cause No. 45253, entitled: "PETITION OF DUKE ENERGY INDIANA, LLC PURSUANT TO IND. CODE §§ 8-1-2-42.7 AND 8-1-2-61, FOR (1) AUTHORITY TO MODIFY ITS RATES AND CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC UTILITY SERVICE THROUGH A STEP-IN OF NEW RATES AND CHARGES USING A FORECASTED TEST PERIOD; (2) APPROVAL OF NEW SCHEDULES OF RATES

AND CHARGES, GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND RIDERS; (3) APPROVAL OF A FEDERAL MANDATE CERTIFICATE UNDER IND. CODE § 8-1-8.4-1; (4) APPROVAL OF REVISED ELECTRIC DEPRECIATION RATES APPLICABLE TO ITS ELECTRIC PLANT IN SERVICE; (5) APPROVAL OF NECESSARY AND APPROPRIATE ACCOUNTING DEFERRAL RELIEF; AND (6) APPROVAL OF A REVENUE DECOUPLING MECHANISM FOR CERTAIN CUSTOMER CLASSES."

- 2. DON attorney, Ms. Cheryl Ann Stone, is an active member in good standing of the State Bar of Indiana (#17574-49). Ms. Stone has appeared and agreed to act as co-counsel before the Commission in Cause No. 45253.
- 3. I, Shannon M. Matera, am not a resident of the state of Indiana, regularly employed in the state of Indiana, or regularly engaged in business or professional activities in the state of Indiana. Rather, I am a resident of, and employed as an attorney in, the state of California.
- 4. In compliance with subdivision (a)(3) of Rule 3 of the Rules for Admission to the Bar and the Discipline of Attorneys, I made payment to the Clerk of the Supreme Court an annual registration fee of one hundred eighty dollars (\$180.00), the amount set forth in Admission and Discipline Rule 2(b), accompanied by a copy of my proposed Verified Petition for Temporary Admission. The receipt for this payment is attached to this Petition.

- 7. The states in which I have ever been licensed to practice law, including the dates of admission to practice and any attorney registration numbers are as follows: (1) New Jersey (#031462003): admitted on December 16, 2003; (2) Pennsylvania (#91183): admitted on October 27, 2003; (3) New York (#4380663): admitted on January 9, 2006; and (4) California (#249440): admitted on June 1, 2007.
- 8. As reflected in Exhibit A, I am an active member in good standing in the state of California. I am registered as Retired from the State Bar of Pennsylvania, having assumed said status on May 13, 2016. I Resigned Without Prejudice from the State Bar of New Jersey, in good standing, pursuant to Rule 1:20-22, effective March 14, 2014. My registration status in New York is "Currently registered": I registered as retired on March 30, 2018 and requested Non-disciplinary Resignation status on September 9, 2019 pursuant to 22 NYCRR §1240.22(a). My request for Non-disciplinary Resignation status in New York is pending with the Supreme Court of the State of New York Appellate Division, First Department.
- 9. I have never been suspended, disbarred or resigned as a result of a disciplinary charge, investigation, or proceeding from the practice of law in any jurisdiction. I do not have any prior acts of misconduct concerning the practice of law in any jurisdiction.
- 10. No disciplinary proceeding is presently pending against me in any jurisdiction. I understand that I have a continuing obligation during the period of temporary admission promptly to advise the court of any disciplinary proceedings.

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- 11. I have not appeared in any court or administrative agency of the state of Indiana during the last five (5) years by temporary admission.
- 12. Good cause exists for my appearance before the Commission in Cause No. 45253 for DON, on behalf of FEA, as the Cause involves a complex field of law in which the DON has special expertise and DON does not have local DON attorneys with adequate expertise in the field involved. As I am an associate counsel with DON, I have a close attorney-client relationship with DON. Duke Energy Indiana, LLC ("Duke") instituted a rate case, Cause No. 45253, including seeking authority to modify its rates and charges. The purpose of this case includes Duke's request for approval to increase its rates and charges, among other matters. As a large customer of Duke with a strategic and vital interest in securing reliable, affordable electricity, FEA has a justiciable interest that may be substantially impacted by the relief requested by Duke and adversely affected by the outcome of this Cause. Thus, there is good cause to grant temporary admission of the DON's counsel of choice, Shannon M. Matera.
- 13. I have read and will be bound by the Rules of Professional Conduct adopted by the Supreme Court, and I consent to the jurisdiction of the State of Indiana, the Indiana Supreme Court, and the Indiana Supreme Court Disciplinary Commission to resolve any disciplinary matter that might arise as a result of the representation.
- 14. Upon the granting of my petition for temporary admission to appear before the Commission in Cause No. 45253, I will file a Notice of Temporary Admission with the Clerk of the Indiana Supreme Court within thirty (30) days after the Court's entry in compliance with Rule 3(2)(b) of the Indiana Rules for Admission to the Bar and Discipline of Attorneys.

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15. I affirm under the penalties for perjury that the forgoing representations are true and accurate to the best of my knowledge and belief.
